From the Crow's Nest: BCB's 2008 Sailing Program

The BCB is preparing for next year's boating program. Although still in the planning stage, this is what we are working toward.

Highlights:

- The beginner program will be expanded to include entering 4th graders.
- Add a new intermediate program for qualified. graduates of the beginner program.
- Expand the Belly Biology to the intermediate program
- Add an adult learn to sail program.
- Add community boating.
- Add BCB Challenge program for sailors with disabilities.

Beginner Opti program for year round Bourne residents entering 4th, 5th and 6th grades. They will learn to row, sail, tie knots, apply the rules of the road, do some basic chart reading, with Belly Biology program one day



per week. Session length: 4 weeks, 5 mornings per week. 2 sessions.

Class size 24. Boats: 15. This program will remain tuition free for Bourne year round residents.

Intermediate Opti program for qualified graduates of the beginner program and for those that can demonstrate an equivalent level of sailing skill. This class will build on the beginner foundation skills in all areas: rowing and boat handling, sailing skills, navigation and rules of the road. It will also introduce basic racing, and provide some experience in other types of sailboats. with Belly Biology

level II one day per week. Session length: 4 weeks, 5 afternoons per week. 2 sessions. Class size 15. Boats: 15.

Belly Biology level II will be offered to the intermediate program and will include field experimentation and snorkeling as a means to observe and gather samples. We are pleased to be able to expand this partnership with



the Briarwood Marine Science Center.

Adult Learn to Sail program for adults and teens. This program will offer sailing instruction in Capris, a four-person boat with main and jib. Weekly instruction will consist of one evening shore side class and Saturday morning instruction on the water. Session length: 4 weeks. 2 sessions.

Class size 9, Boats: 4.

Community Boating Program for adults and children. This program will be offered using the Capris and other boats in the recreational fleet. Before being allowed to take a boat out, participants must be qualified by one of the instructors, which will include a basic sailing and swim test. This program will be offered throughout the summer, one evening per week and Saturday afternoons. Boats will be available by reservation (first come - first serve) to BCB members.

The BCB will be introducing its "Bourne to Sail" program for those with disabilities. We are exploring partnerships with RHCI, Capeable Adventures, Special Olympics and others to assist with this program. Clinics will be offered to introduce those with disabilities to the program. Types of clinics offered will depend on available facilities, suitable boats and the availability of experienced care givers. Clinics/experiences being considered include: Sailing, rowing, kayaking, big boat sailing, belly biology. Please volunteer your skills.

Fleet expansion In support of our growing programs, we will be seeking to acquire up to 10 more Optis, 4 Capris, one or two new chase boats, and 1-2 boats for the BCB "Bourne to Sail" program.

All programs are subject to change as we tailor our resources to the Bourne community's needs and interests. Complete program descriptions and a schedule of fees and scholarships will be posted on the web site as developed.

From the Purser: Financial Update

It is hard to believe that the first year of Bourne Community Boating is behind us. And what a year it is has been! The support we have received from so many members of the community has been overwhelming.

Our donations total over \$55,000 this first year. These donations allowed us to teach 48 Bourne children how to sail and appreciate the waters around our home town.

The 2008 sailing season will bring new and exciting programs to BCB. However, these programs will only be possible with the continued financial support of the community. It costs approximately \$630.00 per student for this past year's program and as you all know the only charge was for a membership. We will continue to offer the beginner Opti program free.

BCB has acquired several larger boats and will be offering an expanded program for 2008.

With expanded programs, expanded facilities and staff required, the continued financial support from the residents and businesses in Bourne is essential. The 2008 estimated budget for Bourne Community Boating is \$100.000. We are 25% there, but we still have a long way to go. Take a few minutes, look at our accomplishments to date and think about how you can help Bourne Community Boating evolve into a boating program we can all be proud to say we helped develop.

I know a real sailor when I see one... The moves and



reflexes of a person that has internalized the feel for wind and water on sails and hull is unmistakable. Sailing not easy for beginners, it requires serious multi-tasking to manage the myriad of forces natural and multiple pieces

related equipment all of which are in constant motion. And that's after you understand what you're supposed to do. Then it takes more time and effort to integrate all of that into the smooth workings of an instinctive sailor.

As I sat watching the final group of BCB's beginners go through their paces at "graduation," I struggled to keep back tears of joy—would have been too embarrassing. It wasn't so much watching them confidently sailing their prescribed courses that moved me—I expected that. It was seeing their bodies move and react that made me realize with a start that in just four short weeks we had taken a bunch of raw, young recruits and turned them into *real sailors*.

When I was asked to write a piece for the newsletter about the success of our first summer, a lot of good things to mention came to mind: our many dedicated volunteers, generous donors, and hardworking instructors; the great feeling of community and cooperation that developed; our wonderful belly biology days with the Briarwood folks; the sound of laughter coming off the water; the smiling young faces as they came and went each day... But for me, the success of our first summer all came down to that one defining moment when I realized we hadn't just run a fun, safe summer program for Bourne children. Our students weren't just a bunch of kids messing joyfully about in boats. I know a real sailor when I see one... and I was seeing more than just one!
